2	<i>Yielding Tide</i>	The anonymous author discusses the increasing number of aquatic elves sighted in the Dragonmere body of water. This book is written in Common.
3	<i>Notes on the Tuigan</i>	Lord Rayburton of Cormyr pens his concerns about the aggressions of the Tuigan people towards the west, with the book containing a number of letters to King Azoun IV asking for increased scrying activity to be placed on these people. This books is written in Common.
4	<i>A Small but Treasonous Chapbook</i>	Written in 1359 DR by Albaertin of Marsember, this book advocates the succession of Marsember from the kingdom of Cormyr and the establishment of governance from the main merchant households of the city, similar to the country of Amn. This book is written in Common.
5	<i>Meditations and Meditations</i>	In this large and unwieldy scroll, Cormyr Scribe Kirkabey describes his efforts to abandon the human need for sleep and substitute it for the meditation the elves use instead. This book is written in Common.
6	<i>The Sad Queen</i>	This book discusses Amlaruil Moonflower, known as the ‘Sad Queen’ Of The Island Of Evermeet. This book is written in Elvish.
7	<i>Contemporary Designs Of Nobel Jewelry</i>	This lavish book contains designs for crowns, scepters, and other jewelry and accessories for monarchy and nobility for the entire Sword Coast, by the Jeweler’s Congress in Daggerford. This book is written in Common.
8	<i>Wine and Vineyards</i>	This purple leather tome is written by Zelphar Thann and describes cultivating and wine making in the Tehyr region. This book is written in Common.
9	<i>Dolorous Days in Daerlūn: My Exile from Cormyr</i>	Jalduth Mimbraer discusses the depression he experienced as he lived his remaining days in Daerlun as an exile from Cormyr. The book briefly discusses his suspicion that the Cult Of The Dragon inhabits this city, but then discusses much of his time on more pleasant times spent that the large of temple of Sune that is located there. This book is written in Common.
10	<i>The First Kingdom of Hmur</i>	Light blue leather binds this waterproof book, which discusses the merfolk of Thalorlyn declaring themselves independent and establishing the Kingdom Of Hmur. This book is written in Common and Aquan.
11	<i>Volo’s Guide to Westgate &amp; the Dragon Coast</i>	This is the sole draft of this tome, dated as of 1363, DR and contains a number of comments and notes written in Common. The person making the comments appears to be a noble of some sort.

12	<i>Collection of Notes on Falconry</i>	This book is a combination of notes collected from various royal falconers in Cormyr. Spending ten downtime days give the reader the capability of training a hooded falcon (use Hawk statistics) as a pet or familiar. This book is written in Common.
13	<i>The Kingdom Of Many Arrows</i>	Green leather binds this Dwarfish book and recounts the establishment of the Kingdom of Many-Arrows by Obould Many-Arrows in 1371 DR.
14	<i>Dissensions of a Chessentan</i>	Yarynous Whaelidon, a noel, expresses his disdain for the practice of elven slavery that Chessenta practiced during the 1350's DR. This book is written in Chessentan.
15	<i>To Serve Fair Fortune</i>	This book is a memoir written by a Calishite mercenary during 442 DR, when the Shoom Imperium dominated most of western Faerun. This book is written in Calishite.
16	<i>The Prisoners' Carnival</i>	This short chapbook discusses the Prisoner's Carnival, Luskan's "court" of justice. This book is written in Common.
17	<i>The View from Sember Heights</i>	One can see the age of the pages inside this book when looking past the clear glass cover. Inside, Aubaerus "the Ravenmaster" discusses how he is using his pet Ravens to try to identify the location of the Crystalline Towers, a holy resting place of the elves that is rumor to be below the surface of the lake. This book is written in Common.
18	<i>An Archmage's Life at Court</i>	Vangerdahast Aeiulvana writes of his trials and tribulations during his first 15 years as the Royal Magician of Cormyr. This book is written in Common.
19	<i>Seasons in the Heartland</i>	Chelm Vandor (scribe of Cormyr) discusses the seasons in the Heartland area of Faerun, with an emphasis on the winters in the Stormhorn Mountains near Cormyr and the dangers that can be found there. This book is written in Common.
20	<i>Discourses on Art and Gems Vol I</i>	This tome gives the reader enough information to identify rare works of art and to be able to appraise them at a price a noble would pay for them.
21	<i>Discourses on Art and Gems Vol II</i>	This tome gives the reader enough information to identify a variety of gemstones and the types of cuts for purposes of appraising them at a price a noble would pay for them.
22	<i>Kings and Worse</i>	This crimson tome written by Ulblood Rathtin, "Royalslayer" of Tethyr acts as a hit list for all the nobles that the self professed assassin has killed throughout the Sword Coast. This book is written in Thieves Cant.
23	<i>Royal Staff Attire</i>	This book contains illustrations for professional attire worn by the staff of the Cormyr Royal Palace. This book is written in Common.
24	<i>Waterdeep's Blue Alley</i>	This book is covered in blue leather with white leather cascading on the bottom made to resemble sea foam. Ellis Adarbrent provides cartographic details on how to navigate Blue Alley, as well as some of the underground city that lies beneath Waterdeep. This book is written in English.

27	<i>Forty Years Before the Doors: A Life in Service Vol I</i>	Here Zanthravas Rolovantar, Lord Chamberlain of Castle Waterdeep recounts the details of when Piergeiron the Paladinson became the Open Lord Of Waterdeep and the changes he instituted to the upkeep of the Castle. This book is written in Common.
28	<i>Forty Years Before the Doors: A Life in Service Vol II</i>	In this volume, Zanthravas Rolovantar, Lord Chamberlain of Castle Waterdeep provides examples of the daily processes and gold expenditure to keep Castle Waterdeep running. This book is written in Common.
29	<i>A Ruler's Guide</i>	This book was written for potential rulers of the Border Kingdoms as a guide for establishing local government and structure of civil service administration. Written by Velm Blackrood, this book is written in Common.
30	<i>Thoughts on a Better Faerūn</i>	Albryngundar of the Singing Sword writes about the idea of the citizens of any particular realm to vote for their leaders and how tax collections are spent. This book is written in Common.
31	<i>Pieces Of Eight, Ways Of Governance</i>	This book discusses proper procedure when dealing with legal matters in Luskan in 1384 DR between the Ship Taerl, Ship Baram, Ship Kurth, Ship Suljack and Ship Rethnor factions. This book is written in Common.
32	<i>Twenty Winters a War Wizard</i>	Seasoned War Wizard Estimyra of High Horn discusses her long career as a War Wizard and the challenges and rewards her tenure of service have yielded.
33	<i>Silla King</i>	This is a series of compiled notes kept in a jade box. This book discusses The King of Silla, who was the ruler of the realm of Silla and later the emperor of the Sillan Empire in the land of Choson on the Koryo Peninsula around 1350 DR. This book is written in Shou.

37	<i>To Rule a Realm, From Turret To Midden</i>	Ralderick Hallowshaw, Jester Extraodinare provides just as much lowbourn humor as he does practical advise for civic planning and administration of services. This book is written in Common.
38	<i>The Speaking Book of Tales Bound</i>	This richly decorated book is written by High Scribe Blaeruityn of Ankhapur, priest of Oghma. Bards that tell tales from this book gain advantage on their performance checks when they tell the first three tales out of the book of their choosing. This book is written in Common.
39	<i>Half a Life: A Halfbreed's Journeys among the Elves</i>	This green leather tome circa 993 DR was written by Hural Artseeker of Rawlinswood, a half elf who went to live in Myth Drannor with his elven mother and his journey to acceptance there. This book is written in Elvish.
40	<i>Volo's Guide to the Bloodstone Lands</i>	This is the sole draft of this tome, dated as of 1362, DR.
41	<i>Proceedings</i>	Magus Firewand of Cormyr discusses proposed disciplinary routines for wayward Wizards Of War. This book is written in Common. Anyone that can cast a second level spell also sees notes and comments by Vangerdahast.
42	<i>Treatise on the History of Pole arms in Warfare</i>	Written by His Royal Highness King Azoun Obarskyr IV of Cormyr, this book imparts the knowledge of all pole arms and training for all pole arm feats as found in the Player's Handbook. This book is written in Common.
43	<i>Slumbertime Stories for Sprigs</i>	This highly worn book is written by Syluné of Shadowdale and contains stories to be read at bedtime for small children. This book is written in Common.
44	<i>Imaskari Book of War Vol I</i>	This is a new copy of this text, but has been made to look as the book is very old. This book describes when the Imaskari took slaves from other worlds in approximately -4730 DR. This book is written in Common.
45	<i>Imaskari Book of War Vol II</i>	This is a new copy of this text, but has been made to look as the book is very old. This book describes when the otherworldly deities of the Imaskari slaves waged war on Imaskar itself, bringing the empire to ruin around -2500 DR. This book is written in Dwarfish.
46	<i>Pinch The King</i>	The author writes of the story of Pinch, thief and scoundrel. Pinch is chosen by the family cup of Ankhapur as it's newest king. This book is written in Common.

49	<i>Lectures to a Youngling</i>	Arivant, sage of Ormath describes proper table manners and etiquette for young lords and ladies that were fashionable at the time when this book is written in 1236 DR. This book is written in Common.
50	<i>Lyres, Harps, and Horns: Sixty Years at Court in Suzail &amp; Elsewhere Vol I</i>	The famous sage of Cormyr gives his perspective on life throughout Cormyr and the wars that have torn it asunder. This book is written in Common.
51	<i>Lyres, Harps, and Horns: Sixty Years at Court in Suzail &amp; Elsewhere Vol II</i>	The famous sage of Cormyr gives his perspective on life throughout Cormyr and talks about how over 400 years later, Thauglor the Purple Dragon is still discussed. This book is written in Common.
52	<i>Lyres, Harps, and Horns: Sixty Years at Court in Suzail &amp; Elsewhere Vol III</i>	The famous sage of Cormyr gives his perspective on life throughout Cormyr and talks about how over 1000 years later, Demonic invasion known as the Weeping War is still discussed. 55	<i>Belabrantas Feather Babies</i>	This book discusses the Belabranta family of Waterdeep, and how the nobles make their fortune breeding and selling Griffons. This book is written in Common.
56	<i>Letters to a Sheltered Son</i>	Oblut Thoim, Master Merchant of Teziir writes to his son about the missed opportunities to amass family wealth by choosing to study magic instead of taking up the family trading business. This book is written in Common.
57	<i>Dogmen of the Shaar</i>	This book is bound from the spotted skin of an unknown creature. This book discusses the Gnolls that inhabit the Shaar region and provides over two dozen phrases in gnoll that are phonetically spelled in Common that can be used for basic communication. This book is written in Common.
58	<i>King Of Justice</i>	This gold leather book discusses the hierarchy of gold dragons and the title King/Queen of Justice, which is bestowed on the oldest and most powerful gold dragon. This book is written in draconic.

61	<i>My Journeys Around the Sea of Fallen Stars Vol II</i>	Nelve Harssad of Turlagol, traveler and author writes about Procampur and discusses Proekampalar, the ancient city that was founded underground by Earthfast dwarves. This is a copy, as the original was written in 1298 DR. This book is written in Common.
62	<i>My Journeys Around the Sea of Fallen Stars Vol III</i>	Nelve Harssad of Turlagol, traveler and author writes about Veltalar, and discusses the Harbor Light, an ancient stone light how that contains magical fire. This is a copy, as the original was written in 1298 DR. This book is written in Common.
63	<i>Treatise Against Blood-Metal</i>	This is a fresh copy of a tome written in 600 DR. The author, Fairin Icemantle, discusses the trend of dwarven smiths creating alloys that are poisonous to orcs and the precedent it sets for similar metals being created for use against all other humanoid races. This books is written in an old dialect of Common.
64	<i>Thoughts on the Realms</i>	This small Chapbook is written by Halidar Thundershield, Lord of Yhep. This book provides information about the Border Kingdoms and other locales close to the Lake of Steam. This book is written in Common.
65	<i>Sumptuary Laws Of The Border Kingdoms</i>	This book is a collection of notes on what information can be found on the Sumptuary Laws Of The Border Kingdoms, which were a body of laws that governed what the types of clothes and jewelry that can be worn by courtesans. This book is written in Common.
66	<i>Shapeshifters Begone!</i>	The Thongolir family writes of the dangers of shapeshifters infesting Waterdeep and taking the identities of nobles. This book is written in Common.
67	<i>Things a Knight Should Know</i>	Myrintar Hasantar, sage of Suzail provides a guide for new Purple Dragon Knights and provides guidelines on just behavior and actions that a Purple Dragon should uphold.

This play discusses the shards, who are a group planetar servants of the goddess Selûne the Moonmaiden and their battles against the agents of Shaar on Faerun. This play is written in Common.

*Treatise on the Flora of the Barren Wastes*

This book contains multiple artist renderings of flowers found throughout the Barren Wastes, and designates which are poisonous, edible, and can aid in healing. This book is written in Common.

*Sumptuary Laws Of Undermountain*

This book is a collection of notes on what information can be found on the Sumptuary Laws of Undermountain, as written by Halaster Blackcloak. These laws are mostly babble and non-sense: "no red swedish fish allowed", "no red t-shirts allowed", and the like. This book is written in Common.

Kastor, Scribe of Cormyr, describes how the observation of insects can possibly used as inspiration for new types of magic spells. This was the only copy of this book as it was a commission for Vangerdahast. This book is written in Common.

*Thoughts for Ladies Fair*

Alairtelle Mistrym, lady of Llorbauth cautions young ladies to not be overly reliant on their good looks, and encourages them to take up commerce as well as proficiency in blades and magic. This book is written in Common.

78

*Elder Days of Amn*

Ortin Blaer, Master Historian of Memnon discusses the founding of the city of Athkatla in 100 DR and cautions would be adventurers away from the Small Teeth mountain range that is nearby, as it has a high population of evil humanoids. This book is written in Common.

79

*Musings of a Shameless Noble*

This book acts as a ledger for all of the dalliances with staff, other nobles, and perfect strangers that Lady Citta Hothemer of Waterdeep has indulged in. This book is written in Common.

*Lord Bhereu's Manual of Standards and Procedure Vol I*

Notes scribbled in chalk on the first page of this tome speculate that the author of this book was Duke Bhereu Huntsilver of Cormyr. This volume discusses the need to confer with local elven populations before moving forward with any deforestation activities. This book is written in Common.

83	<i>Letters to Novice Court Wizards Vol II</i>	In this volume, Vangerdahast provides instruction on basic training for War Wizards, including: Spellcasting in combat, scying, and teleportation. This book is written in Common.
84	<i>Letters to Novice Court Wizards Vol III</i>	In this volume, Vangerdahast describes the final phase of basic training for War Wizards, including: advance magical combat tactics, War Wizard group mission, and impromptu utilization of magic items. This book is written in Common.

94	<i>Musings of a Chessentan Scholar Vol I</i>	Written by Loremaster Myrinter, this volume discusses many of the cults that have risen across Chessenta in recent time, including The Cult of Tchazzar, The Cult of Entropy, and a cult worshiped the archfey Sebakar, the Lord of Crocodiles. This book is written in Common.
95	<i>Musings of a Chessentan Scholar Vol II</i>	Written by Loremaster Myrinter, this volume discusses Tchazzar: was a red dragon who posed as a human warlord and eventually became a god for a time. This book is written in draconic.
96	<i>The Obarskyr Family Histories Vol I</i>	Various anonymous court scribes of Cormyr discuss Obarskyr history, this first volume focuses on Suzail's founder, Ondeth Obarskyr and his interactions with the elves of Cormanthor. This book is written in Common.
97	<i>The Obarskyr Family Histories Vol II</i>	Various anonymous court scribes of Cormyr discuss Obarskyr history, this volume focuses on Raedra Obarskyr and the circumstances of her assuming the thrown. This book is written in Common.
